LIBRARY NEWS

The new Murrieta Public Library is moving along. We are getting comments back from the Office of Library Construction and we will be sending our construction documents to them within a few weeks. The council approved an agenda item for a prequalification process for construction manager. All these steps get us closer to the groundbreaking, which gets us closer to actual construction, which gets us closer to an opening!

There are many exciting things in the works. A sign will be placed near the Library's site. This will have announcements regarding the new Library such as upcoming bidding, construction progress, general information, or anything staff feels the public would find interesting. It is not for advertising, but information. We are very excited about it.

Also, February is *Library Lover's Month*. We will kick off the month with a FOOD FOR FINES program. You can bring one can of food for each dollar to be removed from your patron record. You can bring up to 10 cans or \$10 to the Library February 1st through February 5th. This is for Murrieta residents only. All cans of food will be taken to St. Martha's Pantry. Council presented a proclamation at the January 18th council meeting.

We received a \$150,000 grant for literacy to be used for the new Library. Most of the grant is for technology and materials. We received a grant of \$45,000 to be applied to our video conferencing center.




