GARDENING AUTHOR PAT WELSH TO SPEAK ON "TEN TIPS FOR A SMART GARDEN"

We were able to reschedule Pat Welsh to come and speak at our next meeting, February 21st at the Murrieta Senior Center at 10:30 a.m. She is best known as the author of "Pat Welsh's Southern California Gardening: a Month by Month Guide." For many years she hosted a popular garden segment called "The Resident Gardner" on NBC News in San Diego. She is the recipient of many awards, including the San Diego Emmy, three national Quill and Trowel Awards, the Quail Gardens Lifetime Achievement Award and the San Diego Horticultural Society's Horticulturalist of the Year 2003. She will show us colorful slides illustrating "Ten Tips for a Smart Garden."

Pat is also an artist who designed and built (along with fellow-artist Betsy Schulz and 80 other volunteers) a 92 foot mural which covers the retaining wall of the Del Mar Public Library. Her latest book "The Magic Mural and How It Got Built, a Fable for Children of all Ages" tells the story of this mural and is illustrated with drawings and paintings by the author. Pat was born in England and has lived in various parts of Southern California for over 50 years. She now lives and gardens in Del Mar.




