Dear Friends ~

As I'm sure you have heard or read, the Governor is proposing the elimination of all state funds allocated to public libraries throughout the state. Governor Brown's justification for this decision is that public libraries should be the responsibility of local government. As of this writing, the Assembly and Senate are at an impasse regarding the budget proposal with the Assembly proposing to reduce the funding while the Senate is siding with the Governor to fully eliminate all state funding. Should this funding be eliminated, some public libraries will close and some will have to reduce some or all of the following: hours, staffing, programs and/or collections. The bottom line is the impact on YOU the community. Public libraries exist for you. The reduction or elimination of funds will affect your access to information, resources (books, DVDs, CDs, databases), programs (including children's, teen, young adult and adult), as well as services, such as computers and reference assistance.

I would like to thank those of you who have written letters to our local legislators supporting the continuation of state funding to public libraries, as well those of you who visited the local representatives on Legislative Day. The funding from the state to the public libraries is for YOU, just as the money that the Friends raise and give to the Library ultimately benefits YOU; we ~ the Library staff ~ are just the pass-through! 
