MURRIETA PUBLIC LIABRARY NEWS

Dear Friends ~

I have so much to share with you, but what is most important is to first wish you a happy 15^{th} anniversary! It is such an understatement to say that without you, there would be no Murrieta Public Library; without you there would be no fun and educational programs; without you the Library's collection of resources would not be as well-rounded. Many of you have put your heart and soul into this organization for the benefit of the community; to have a place of culture. That is really what having a public library is all about ~ culture. Public Library services (including programs and collections) are all about providing a private world where one can expand their horizons as an individual or group through reading, participating in programs and volunteering. This is the place where the past, the present and the future co-exist simultaneously, where the love of reading and life-long learning really happen. This is what makes a cultured, progressive and economically successful community! THANK YOU FRIENDS for taking your valuable time and investing it ~ for 15 years ~ into the Murrieta community through the Library! I love working with all of you and look forward to many more years of having a fun and successful relationship that supports the residents of Murrieta!

I am pleased to tell you that the Summer Reading Program of 2011 was very successful and extremely well attended \sim almost to a fault! The programs held in the Community Room were beyond capacity, which motivated us to look for other venues \sim such as the amphitheater in Town Square Park. A few statistics to share comparing last year's numbers to this year's:

There was a higher participation for all three levels of programs: children's, teen/young adult, and adults.

- The average ratio of participation was higher for program attendance in the children's and adult catagories even though the number of programs held was less.
- The teen and young adults preferred to read rather than attend the programs. Library staff feel that the incentive to win the great baskets of goodies, donated by local businesses was the key to their reading participation.

The total reading program participants of all three groups was 1,396 people with 21,720 books read!

Many thanks to the Friends of the Murrieta Library who donated \$10,000 for the Summer Reading Program as well as to the local businesses for their gift sponsorships.

On Thursday, August 11, 2011, the Murrieta Valley Town Hall Association Endowment Board met to disburse the interest earned from the Principal of the Endowment to the three entities as prescribed in its bylaws. This year a total of \$2,932.37 was allocated as follows: \$1,466.16 to the Murrieta Library and \$733.09 each to the Friends of the Murrieta Library and the Murrieta Valley Unified School District. The funds received by the Library will be combined with last year's funds to purchase special career and math and sciences collections. Of course, we thank the Murrieta Valley Town Hall Association Endowment Board for their generosity in allocating these funds each year.

September is always an interesting month in the public libraries across our Nation as we celebrate two significant issues related to providing high quality services to our communities, which are Library Card Sign-up Month and Banned Books Week.

As Murrieta students head back to school this September, the Murrieta Public Library wants to make sure that all students have the most important school supply of all – a library card.

Banned Books Week is an annual event celebrating the freedom to read and the importance of the First Amendment. Held during the last week of September, which this year is September 24 to October 1, Banned Books Week highlights the benefits of free and open access to information while drawing attention to the harms of censorship by spotlighting actual or attempted bannings of books across the United States.

Intellectual freedom is the freedom to access information and express ideas, even if the information and ideas might be considered unorthodox or unpopular. BBW stresses the importance of ensuring the availability of unorthodox or unpopular viewpoints for all who wish to read and access them. Banned Books Week is celebrated each year to teach the importance of our First Amendment rights and the power of literature, and to draw attention to the danger that exists when restraints are imposed on the availability of information in a free society.
