As always, the staff and I are grateful for your willingness to give your time, energy, and talents to help support the Murrieta Public Library. We thank all of you for your continual enthusiasm, dedication, and passion that help us remain steadfast and purposefully driven to make a difference in the lives of our community members.

The Children's Area expansion project continues to progress. The construction and bid documents are expected to be completed in February 2025 and the construction bidding and contract award to occur in the months following. In the meantime, meetings are being held to go over the furniture, fixtures and equipment for the new space and fundraising efforts continue as well.

A wide variety of programs and events are coming up for all ages. For children, storytimes continue Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays through mid-November, and Dog Tales continues on Monday afternoons through December 16. There will also be a STEM Lab class on November 26 and a Kids Grow Garden Club meeting on December 11. Teens can look forward to two Coding Club classes, one on November 2 and another on December 14. There will also be a Bubble Wrap Art class on November 6 and Library Bingo on November 16. For adults, there will be a Quiet Reading Book Club on November 4 and December 2, a presentation on financial strategies, concepts, and solutions for college expenses on November 18, as well as a Bibliogami class on November 21. Dear Friends,

At the Town Square Bookstore, we meet hundreds of people every month and they all smile. They smile when they donate their books and we thank them. They smile when they find the PERFECT book, or better yet, a book they have been trying to find for a long time. And our volunteers reciprocate with a smile because we love to help others.

We smile with the numerous donations of books, CDs, DVDs: fiction, non-fiction, adult, teen, and children. Our donors are thoughtful and provide us with several hundred books per week. Thank you to all of the volunteers who sort, clean, price, and shelve books during their shifts at the Town Square Bookstore. We thank our Internet pricers Laurie Razo and Evie Dial. A good portion of our income is generated by Internet sales.

In September, we started our new \$2 a bag book sale. We wondered if anyone would attend. Indeed many people stopped in and bought a bag, or two, of books (DVDs,CDs) on our first day. Many people also bought items at the store. Luckily we had numerous volunteers to get us through a lot of sales. Imagine the smiles generated by our sales that day: \$769!! Our October 26 \$2 a bag sale was equally as awesome, bringing in \$245! Our November \$2 a bag sale will be on Saturday, Nov 23. As the Library opens at noon, the \$2 a bag sale in the Community Room and the Town Square Bookstore will open from noon to 4 pm on the sale days.

With Thanksgiving and Christmas around the corner, we want to congratulate and thank our hardworking volunteers who donate their time and energy to the store. You are incredibly kind, thoughtful, and hardworking! Our November/December calendar will be modified to enable our volunteers to be with family and friends as much as possible. Town Square will be open: Tuesday, Nov 26, 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.; and Wednesday, Nov 27, from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. We will be closed Thursday, Nov 28, and Saturday, Nov. 30. The December holidays coincide with our normal hours, therefore we will be closed: Dec 24, 25, 26, 28. And closed as well on Dec 31, Jan 1, Jan 2.
